

Nominations are open for the 2022

BERNI J. ALDER CECAM PRIZE

The prize honours an individual scientist who has made an outstanding contribution to computational science in the fields explored by CECAM. In exceptional circumstances, teams of up to three scientists with equally relevant merits for the rewarded contribution are considered. The award consists of a plaque and the sum of €5000.

The call will close on **March 31 2022** and the decision on the award will be communicated by June 1 2022.

In considering potential nominees, CECAM invites you to think broadly: strong scientific impact can be achieved in different ways and it is important not to overlook unusual or less typically acknowledged contributions. CECAM also encourages nominations considerate of diversity in all its forms.

Nominations are submitted individually or as representative of a larger community by a single coordinating nominator. Coordinators can submit only one nomination, self-nominations are not allowed.

Nominations should be submitted via the CECAM website at

and must include:

1. a clear description of the work for which the prize is to be awarded and a separate section detailing the overall impact of the nominee(s) activities on the simulation and modelling community. The description of the work of the nominee should not exceed 1000 words. It should include a listing of no more than six key publications for the candidate.

2. CV of the nominee(s)
